Minutes of April 27, 2022

Public Hearing

The duly warned public hearing of the Board of Trustees was electronically held on April 27, 2022.

Clerk, Peter Gallo opened the public hearing at 7:05 p.m. introductions were made, and the meeting was turned over to Paul Nesky, President.

Paul Nesky asked for any comments relating to Article 1, Election of a President for the ensuing year. There were no comments or questions relating to the article.

There were no comments or questions on Article 2, approval of prior year meetings summarization or Article 7, approval of the 2022 General Department tax rate. Article 8, due date and delinquent tax payments discussion Sue Trainor asked if it was different than prior years, it is not.

Jack Anderson requested a review of the process for the annual meeting. Paul Nesky read the information for voters that was inserted in the mailing. Jack asked when the polls open and closed. Polls open at 9am and close at 7pm.

There was discussion about the current road construction on State Route 15 and the need to plan for delays this summer. Jack Anderson noted Prospect St. was recently paved.

Laurie Burnham, asked about the utility budgets and how voting for approval of those budgets happens. The Utility budgets are approved by the Trustees who perform double duty as utility Commissioners.

Sue Trainor asked if legal fees for the water lawsuit are in the General Department budget. The general Department budget does not have any revenue or expenses of the utilities.

There was discussion of the Federal ARPA funds. Paul Nesky asked if the funds had been spent yet. The funds have not been spent yet Carol, GM. stated that the Board of Trustees decided to take the lost Revenue option which reduces the requirements for reporting making it easier to administer. Funds must be fully spent by 2026.

Sue Trainor asked about the rent income, zoning expenses, and painting items in the General budget. The Zoning bylaws need to be updated for compliance with new State requirements, rent income is rent funds received from the utility departments for use of the Village owned warehouse, painting of the warehouse is planned in 2022.

There being no further business, motion by Jack Anderson and second by Peter Gallo to adjourn the public hearing at 7:30 p.m. The motion carried.
